Online tool helps people book appointments with Service BC

Technology / Public Administration

People can now make an appointment online before visiting **Service BC**. This reduces lineups, saves time and makes it easier to maintain physical distancing, helping keep visitors, staff and communities safe.

Appointments can be scheduled through the mobile BC Services Card, online:

https://appointments.servicebc.gov.bc.ca/appointment People can also call their nearest Service BC location.

Service BC helps people access hundreds of different programs and services offered by the B.C. government, including income assistance, residential tenancy applications and the **Affordable Childcare Benefit**.

The 65 locations throughout B.C. have taken steps to protect public safety during the COVID-19 pandemic. In addition to the new online appointment tool, Service BC centres regularly sanitize public and office spaces and have modified reception areas to accommodate physical distancing. Masks are mandatory at all Service BC locations and will be provided for people who do not have one.

Those using the mobile **BC Services Card** to book an appointment must download the app and set up their mobile

card first. Setting up a mobile card only takes a few minutes and can be done from a mobile device.

The mobile BC Services Card makes it easy for people to quickly and safely access government services online, such as making a Service BC appointment, anywhere at any time. Additional services accessible through the mobile card include:

- Health Gateway, including COVID-19 test results as soon as they are available;
- StudentAidBC; business registration;
- B.C. billing and payment services;
- personal freedom of information requests;
- Employment and Social Development Canada's My Service Canada Account (Old Age Security, Canada Pension Plan, Canada Pension Plan Disability, Employment Insurance); and
- Canada Revenue Agency's MyAccount, where individuals can view and manage personal income tax and benefit information.

People may also get assistance by calling the Service BC provincial contact centre, which offers support over the phone in 120 languages. People are asked to call a Service BC centre, rather than coming into an office, if:

- they are showing symptoms of COVID-19, including coughing, shortness of breath and fever;
- they have a sick family member or have been around someone who is sick; and/or
- they have not yet completed the 14-day isolation period after travelling abroad.

People can get help and access government services through Service BC's provincial contact centre from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. (Pacific time), Monday to Friday (except statutory holidays by telephone: (toll free) 1 800 663-7867 (available in 120 languages).

Scotiabank pledges \$500M for 'disadvantaged' education, career advancement

Bank of Nova Scotia will spend \$500 million over the next decade on a new program that aims to break down barriers to higher education and career advancement for "disadvantaged" groups.

The Toronto-based bank announced Tuesday that the **ScotiaRISE** program will be centred on using funding and partnerships to increase graduation rates and post-secondary enrolment, help newcomers feel at home faster and secure meaningful employment and senior opportunities for underrepresented groups.

Dan Rees, Scotiabank's group head of Canadian banking, said his company had long been considering launching a program like ScotiaRISE, but really got serious about the idea at the start of 2020.

Then COVID-19 swept across Canada and the bank knew it couldn't wait any longer.

"The importance of being resilient has been doubled and... it felt especially important to be investing in education, inclusion and employment for young people and for newcomers from marginalized groups," Rees said.

"Now is the time to emphasize optimism and hope and inclusion."

Research has repeatedly shown that women, immigrants and others who are Indigenous, Black or have disabilities face more challenges when getting an education and when they make it to the workforce, they tend to earn less and have a harder time ascending to top positions.

The COVID-19 pandemic has exacerbated their struggles because many are taking on additional childcare responsibilities now that students are completing virtual schooling and others are seeing the industries they work in be desecrated by the virus.

With unemployment high, students and new graduates are seeing job opportunities shrink and starting careers become tougher.

ScotiaRISE plans to help them overcome some of their challenges by working with charities, not-for-profits and community initiatives providing tools needed to increase their likelihood of financial success.

While the bank won't be setting formal targets to measure its success with the program, Rees said it will annually review its progress to ensure its actions are having the intended effect.

The program will have a domestic and international focus so everyone from an internationally trained doctor seeking work in Toronto to a high school graduate in Chile can be supported.

The bank said it wanted a wide reach because it has a large presence abroad, especially in Latin America.
