Hard Working	Punctual & Dependable	You are always on time and prepared.		
	Work Ethic	You take pride in your work. You follow direction carefully and work quickly yet safely.		
	Optimistic Mindset	You participate and do not complain about your assigned tasks.		
	Attention to Detail	You are careful to produce good quality work.		
Responsible	Identify, Own and Correct Problems	You can recognize a problem, take ownership and find a solution.		
	Demonstrate Follow Through	You complete what you start, needing minimal direction.		
	Safety First	You follow safe practices at all times. You ask before you expose yourself or others to risks.		
Show Initiative	Self-Starter	You can be left to finish a task and will assist others without being asked.		
	Demonstrate Flexibility	You are open to taking on new roles or challenges.		
Team Player	Understand Role	You see yourself as part of a team and actively support others.		
	Contribute Ideas	You offer your constructive input.		
	Engaged	You are engaged in the task at hand.		
Ready to Learn	Ask Questions	You ask questions as problems arise.		
	Problem Solving	You can offer solutions and ideas to the problems you identify.		
	Growth Mindset	You demonstrate a realistic understanding of your skills and knowledge. You are open to feedback to help you grow.		
Communication	Listening and Understanding	You can follow instructions and obtain information.		
	Speaking	You can exchange thoughts and information verbally.		

Step 1 – Skills Inventory

Reading	Understand	You understand written information related to safety and job training.	
Writing	Convey	You can write typed or handwritten text to communicate information and ideas.	
Numeracy	Calculate	You understand and can add, subtract, multiply, divide, and round whole numbers, decimals, percentages and fractions.	
Document Use	Interpret	You can read and interpret documents such as graphs, charts, lists, tables and more.	
Digital	Navigate	You can understand and process information from digital sources, use digital systems, technical tools and applications.	
Social and Cross-Cultural	Inclusive	You respect cultural differences and can work with people with varying social and cultural backgrounds.	
	Interact	You respond open-mindedly to different ideas and values.




Step 2 – Part A: Mind Map Activity


