**The Talk:** I will reprise my TED<sup>x</sup> Edmonton 2017 talk to introduce the research used in Canada to support why we do Career Education, how vocational identity and hope theory are the strongest methods to tether students to a path that builds the critical competency of adaptability, the key ingredient to be ready for the future. I use storytelling to build the value in career education courses and why these courses are critical in potentially getting a student engaged in school.
